**Chapter 9 Matrices And Transformations 236 Addition And Subtraction Of Matrices Is Defined Only For Matrices Of Equal Order; The Sum (difference) Of Matrices A And B Is The Matrix Obtained By Adding (subtracting) The Elements In Corresponding Positions Of A And B.
